

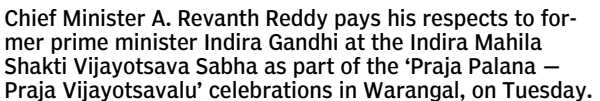

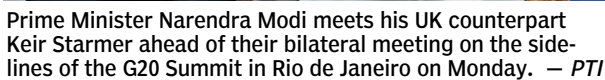

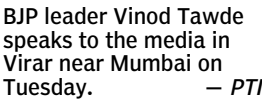

The judges held that insertion Section 10-A was ultra vires the Constitution and not in accordance with the principles of public service recruitment.

Despite invalidating insertion of Section 10-A, the Court refrained from terminating the services of 5,544 contractual employees whose appointments were regularised via GO Ms No. 38 on April 30, 2023.

The bench reasoned that these employees had served on a contractual basis since 2009, and dismissing them would be inequitable given their decade-long tenure.

Dr B. Rajeshkhanna, general secretary, Telangana All Universities Contract Teachers' Association (TAUCTA), welcomed the Telangana High Court's decision to strike down GO No. 16.

He expressed optimism about the path forward for university contract faculty members. "This decision offers a

real opportunity to finally regularise the 1,445 university contract faculty who have been left out of earlier efforts due to their institutions' autonomous status," he told *Deccan Chronicle*.

Dr Rajeshkhanna urged the government to move quickly, stressing the need for immediate action by newly appointed Vice Chancellors and governing bodies to address the situation.

Supriya Gopa, a health-care worker on contract, said, "Our concern is that this decision might lead to additional delays in job opportunities for thousands of unemployed youth, especially as the government pushes to regularise certain groups first. While we respect long-serving contract employees, there must also be a fair focus on new job creation for those waiting."

N.V.S. REDDY'S REMARKS SPARK GOVT BACKLASH

HMRL managing director N.V.S. Reddy portraying the city Metro Rail in poor light hasn't go down well with the top brass of state administration.

The government, according to sources, has actively been considering a replacement for N.V.S. Reddy, at the helm of affairs for over 15 years.

At a programme on Monday, Reddy had said the L&T, the Hyderabad Metro Rail concessionaire, had been suffering from huge losses of ₹1,300 crore per annum, which had accumulated to ₹6,000 crore in the last few years.

He said banks were shying away from giving loans for the expansion of the Metro Rail project.

The MD's observations came at a time when the Revanth Reddy-led state government was all set to launch the second and third phases of Metro Rail with an outlay of nearly ₹25,000 crore. "This is shocking and completely unwarranted. We recently accorded administrative sanction for the project and have been trying hard to approach international funding agencies," said a senior state official. "As head of institution, N.V.S. Reddy cannot talk ill of the project and portray it as loss-making," the official added.

There were reports earlier that L&T was trying to exit from the project due to losses, part of which occurred due to delays post state bifurcation. Then Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao had stalled the project by insisting on certain changes in the alignment but finally okayed the previous one.

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BURGLARS LOOT ₹10 CR GOLD FROM BANK

Gorekar booked the flat in 2012, and the agreement in 2016, with the developer promising possession by December 2017. Despite paying over 95 per cent of cost, ₹63.75 lakh, the work remained incomplete.

Aliens Developers blamed the delays on the 2008 financial crisis, Telangana's bifurcation, and the pandemic.

TGRERA ordered the developer to pay 10.95 per cent annual interest from December 2017 until the property is handed over.

Bhatti vows no forced land acquisition

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Tuesday reiterated that the Congress government would not forcibly acquire land from farmers for development projects.

"The Congress government is not forcibly grabbing lands like the BRS regime did. Those who auctioned farmers' assigned land and profited from it cannot claim moral high ground," Bhatti said, likening the BRS's actions to "demons reciting the Vedas."

Addressing a gathering at Gandhi Bhavan on Tuesday during the birth anniversary celebrations of former prime minister Indira Gandhi, Bhatti accused the previous BRS government of seizing over 10,000 acres of assigned land around

Hyderabad that were originally given to the poor by the past Congress governments.

"The BRS leadership provoked innocent farmers in Lagcharla and attacked officials as part of a conspiracy for political gains," he alleged, adding that the Congress government would not

repeat such actions.

He paid glowing tributes to Indira Gandhi, describing her as a visionary leader who transformed India through land reforms, the nationalisation of banks, and policies aimed at social equality. "Indira Gandhi's life was a testament to her dedication to national unity and

integrity. She sacrificed her life for the stability of this country," he said.

Bhatti praised Indira Gandhi's contributions to foreign policy and her efforts to unite diverse communities across India. "The Congress government in Telangana is committed to following her path by working towards equality and empowering the poor," he added.

Bhatti highlighted the Congress government's initiatives, including the ongoing caste census, which he claimed would create a roadmap for equitable development. "We passed a resolution in the Legislative Assembly to begin a scientific and comprehensive caste census. This survey will enable the government to provide equal opportunities and make Telangana a role model for the country," he said.

Emphasising the government's focus on women, he announced various schemes inspired by Indira Gandhi's vision. "We launched a free bus scheme for women within an hour of assuming office, paying ₹400 crore monthly to the RTC for women's transportation costs. We are also providing ₹20,000 crore in interest-free loans annually to empower women and make them entrepreneurs," Bhatti said.

"The people's government in Telangana will continue to respect women as pillars of society and provide equal opportunities for all. We are determined to make this state a beacon of progress and unity," he stated.

Some autonomous colleges, few others decided to continue academic schedules

Degree colleges strike over arrears payment

The indefinite strike launched by the Telangana State Private Degree and PG Colleges Management Association over delayed fee reimbursement arrears unfolded with considerable confusion on Tuesday.

While several institutions shut their doors in solidarity with the protest, others remained operational, leaving students grappling with a lack of clarity regarding their classes and semester examinations.

● MANAGEMENT associations said October's government assurances remain unfulfilled, leaving colleges with unpaid salaries, rising utility bills, and pressing rental due, straining financial stability.

The strike was called to highlight the pending fee reimbursement arrears spanning the last two academic years, a situation the association claims has severely strained their financial stability.

"Despite persistent efforts to engage with

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and other concerned officials, there has been no concrete response. Higher education is being sidelined," said association president Dr B. Suryanarayana Reddy.

General secretary Yada Ramakrishna expressed frustration over the government's unfulfilled assurances.

The impact on students was immediate and chaotic. "When I reached my college, the gates were shut with no information on whether classes would be held or exams would continue," said Sai Kiran

Rao, a final-year student. "Everyone was calling around trying to get updates, but there was no clarity. For those of us with attendance issues, this added more stress."

For some students, the confusion was worsened by travel difficulties.

"I had an important practical exam today and travelled a long distance to attend it," said Reshma Shaik, a postgraduate student.

"When I arrived, I was told the exam had been postponed. It's frustrating, especially when exam schedules are already

tight. Usually we're notified in advance, but it appeared as if the college itself had no clarity on whether or not to declare the bandh until 9.30 am," she told DC. Not all institutions adhered strictly to the bandh call.

Autonomous colleges and a few others chose to continue their academic schedule.

"We opted to hold classes as planned so that students do not lose out on their preparation for semester exams," a college representative explained.

"We support the cause and the need for financial

aid, but stopping education entirely isn't a solution. We are considering alternative methods of expressing our protest."

While some institutions moved forward with their semester exam schedule, others chose to pause all activities.

The management associations pointed out that a previous strike in October ended with assurances from the government, which remain unfulfilled. The ever-increasing arrears have left colleges with unpaid staff salaries, accumulating utility bills, and pressing rental dues.

Will make Warangal 2nd major city in TG: Revanth

CM launches infra, welfare projects worth ₹4,848.47 cr in Warangal

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Tuesday said that the Congress government was focussed on the development of North Telangana region and unveiled his vision to transform Warangal into the second major city in Telangana, following Hyderabad.

As part of the Congress government's commitment, Revanth Reddy launched a series of infrastructure and welfare projects worth ₹4,848.47 crore in Warangal district. These initiatives were unveiled during the 'Praja Palana Vijayotsava' at Arts College in Hanamkonda, marking the first anniversary of the Congress government in the state.

Highlighting the lack of sufficient airports compared to neighboring states which have four to five, Revanth Reddy announced plans to establish four airports, including at Warangal, Kothagudem and Ramagundam. "The Congress government is ready to enhance regional connectivity, starting with a ₹205 crore allocation for the Mamnoon airport in Warangal," he said.

Revanth Reddy emphasised Warangal's historical and cultural significance, referring to its rich heritage from the Kakatiya dynasty. "Warangal's lakes and tanks are treasures of the Kakatiya kings. Developing this city on all fronts is my top priority, and I will not rest until this is achieved," he asserted.

The government's commitment to Warangal is underscored by its ₹6,000 crore allocation for the city's development. "If Warangal flourishes, half of Telangana will be developed," the CM said, pledging to work tirelessly until the historical city matches Hyderabad in prominence and infrastructure.

Referring to Kishan Reddy's criticism that Revanth Reddy was "Sonia's slave", the CM said: "Sonia Gandhi is the mother of Telangana's 4 crore people. Touching her feet and seeking blessings is not servitude; it's respect."

He accused Kishan Reddy of betraying Telangana by aligning with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who once belittled the passage of the statehood legislation in Parliament. "Without Sonia Gandhi, the six-decade long dream of achieving statehood for Telangana would not have been fulfilled. Modi insulted and betrayed the

people of Telangana with his statement in Parliament that the Telangana Bill was passed in an improper manner by closing doors and switching off lights. Kishan Reddy should be ashamed of doing *gulangiri* to Modi who insulted Telangana. He should wash the feet of Sonia Gandhi and sprinkle water on his head to get rid of at least some of his sins," he said, referring to the BJP state president.

Revanth Reddy said Kishan Reddy had no moral right to stay in Telangana and he should pack his bags and leave for Gujarat. "Kishan Reddy boasts Modi cleansed the Sabarmati river in

Gujarat. Why is he obstructing the cleaning of the Musi river here? Instead of sleeping near the Musi river, he should be thankful to the people of Secunderabad who made him MP, and not Modi," Revanth Reddy said.

He highlighted the Congress government's achievements in its 10-month rule, including creating 50,000 government jobs, waiving ₹18,000 crore in farm loans for 22 lakh farmers, and facilitating the cultivation of a record 66 lakh metric tonnes of paddy.

Nearly 136 mn tonnes of silt accumulated

Kadam reservoir to be desilted

The irrigation department will take up a pilot project of desilting reservoirs in the state starting with the Kaddam reservoir in Nirmal district and work is expected to begin next February.

The government on Tuesday issued orders approving the desilting of reservoirs in the state and adopting a revenue generation model by selling the retrieved sand

and clay. The government said it has been decided to adopt the National Sediment Management Guidelines issued by the Union ministry of Jal Shakti.

Kaddam, picked for the pilot project, is believed to have lost, over the decades, around 40 per cent of its water holding capacity of 7.6 tmc ft (thousand million cubic feet) down to around 4.8 tmc ft. Irrigation department officials estimate that nearly 136 million

tonnes of silt has accumulated at the reservoir.

While the composition of the silt at reservoirs can vary depending on the soil types of the catchment of the river on which a dam is built, at Kaddam, officials believe that some 40 per cent of the silt could be sand that can be used in the construction industry, while the rest is mostly clay that can be used to supplement soil nutrition in agricultural fields.

"We hope the work can

begin in February and be completed by May in the coming year," a senior irrigation department official said.

While most reservoirs in the state too have experienced silting over the decades, the worst hit, according to a report by the Central Water Commission, is Nizamsagar, which lost 60 per cent of its holding capacity, while Nagarjunasagar reservoir's capacity went down by 23 per cent.

CM backs prevention against thalassaemia

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Tuesday pledged his commitment to support measures aimed at preventing thalassaemia, during a meeting with the Thalassaemia and Sickle Cell Society (TSCS) president Chan-

drakant Agarwal and society members. The delegation stressed the need for a government order (GO) to establish a robust prevention framework for thalassaemia, which remains a pressing health issue.

Fraudsters swindle senior citizen of ₹4.7L in OTP scam

Scammers sent APK files to victim, she clicked on it, money debited

Cyberfraudsters duped a senior citizen of ₹4.7 lakh in a one-time password (OTP) scam, cheated by someone whom she believed to be an e-commerce customer helpline executive. This was a repeat of a recent incident where another pensioner had tried to access the helpline of a pharmacy app, and landed up with a fraudster who cheated him of ₹4 lakh.

In the latest complaint, a 67-year-old victim lodged a complaint at the city cybercrime unit (CCU) on Tuesday after she noticed ₹4.7 lakh transferred from her account after she attempted to pay for a parcel that she had ordered from the e-commerce portal. The victim received a call from a person who claimed to be a delivery agent for

the e-commerce portal and had come to deliver her order. However, she found it was not the article that she had ordered. The victim then called the e-commerce portal helpline. A person who spoke Hindi received her call and asked her to transfer ₹10 as the fee to raise a complaint, a CCU official said, citing from the complaint. Trusting him, she transferred ₹10 through a payment app. The fraudster sent an APK file to her WhatsApp number in the name of customer care and asked her to click it, the officer said. The moment the

victim clicked on that file, she got a message that ₹4.7 lakh was debited from her account. "We have received the victim's complaint and have informed the National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP). The investigation is in progress," said the investigation officer.

This was similar to the scam that took place on November 10. A retired employee from Ramanthapur was attempting to update his address on a medicine delivery app. He searched for the app's customer care on a search engine, and called a number that came up. An executive asked him to pay ₹2 to update his address. The pensioner did so without hesitation.

He then saw money getting debited from his account and eventually ended up poorer by ₹4 lakh.



Impersonator gyps employee of ₹1.7L

A 30-year-old woman from Hyderabad lost ₹1.7 lakh to a scamster who claimed that he was her boss, and was in need of money. The victim was an employee with a private company, police said. Her ordeal began with a WhatsApp message from what looked like her boss's number in which he claimed that he was in need of money. The message was sent from a different series of mobile number but after the scamster claimed he was the boss, the victim as convinced. He claimed he was need of money and that his mobile payment app was not working. He provid-

ed a different number and asked her to transfer the amount for an urgent business transaction. He promised to repay the next morning. The victim sent a total of ₹1.7 lakh.

She discovered the scam when her boss informed her he had not sent any message nor made any request for money. After investigating, it was revealed that the fraudster had gained access to her boss's WhatsApp account, and used it to impersonate him. Cases are filed for impersonation and cheating.



₹243 cr Blossoms Oils assets attached

The Enforcement Directorate (ED), Hyderabad, said it had attached immovable properties with a book value of ₹243 crore belonging to Sarvade Vinod Kumar and Jan Shakti Oil Products, represented by M. Venkata Nagendra, under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

Jan Shakti Oil Products is a sister company of Blossoms Oils & Fats, which allegedly violated money laundering norms in 2002.

According to a statement issued by the ED, Blossoms Oils and Fats, and its directors have defrauded Indian Overseas Bank and Indian

● **BLOSSOMS OILS** and Fats, and its directors have defrauded Indian Overseas Bank and Indian Bank by availing loans on the basis of forged documents. They diverted the loan proceeds for personal use through their associate group companies, causing ₹266.74-crore loss to the two banks.

The CBI filed a chargesheet on February 19, 2019 in the court of special sessions judge for CBI cases in Hyderabad. The ED initiated an investigation on the basis of an FIR registered by the CBI of Bengaluru, against Blossoms Oils & Fats Ltd and others.

PLAINT AGAINST FOUR MEDICOS FOR RAGGING JUNIOR

Nalgonda Town-I police on Monday filed cases against four students of the Nalgonda Government Medical College for ragging a junior student.

According to sources, the junior student belonged to Kerala while the seniors who ragged him also belonged to the same state.

The junior sought help from other seniors from Kerala who reprimanded the perpetrators. But the four accused got angry and physically attacked the junior three days back. The four seniors were already suspended from the college by the principal.

Thirty students travelling in a school bus had a narrow escape after the driver almost fainted while at the wheel. The bus dashed against a tree after the driver lost control over the vehicle.

The incident occurred at Kundanpally near Keesara on the outskirts of Hyderabad on Tuesday morning. The Keesara police charged the driver with rash and negligent driving. According to sub-inspector Srinivas Reddy, Y. Raju, a driver for Divine Grace International School's bus, picked up students from in and around Keesara in the morning. While he was heading towards the school, he felt dizzy. Only the driver suffered minor injuries after he hit the steering wheel,

and the students did not suffer any injuries.

The police checked if the driver was holding a licence and was drunk. His breathalyser test was negative.

The police questioned the driver, who had been working with the school for five years. He confessed that he felt dizzy and lost control over the vehicle. He was later admitted to a nearby hospital and is yet to be discharged. The accused Raju, will be served notices after he is discharged, police said. A suo motu case has been filed by the police for rash or negligent action that endangers human life or personal safety.

The SI said, if a case was registered, RTO will be approached to inspect the vehicle fitness and if the driver is also in condition to drive a school bus.

A video in which a tiger was seen crossing the road went viral on social media and it was falsely claimed that it was at Laltekdi in Uttnoor on November 17.

The same day, Adilabad DFO Prashanth Bajirao Patil visited a forest area on the outskirts of Jamada mandal in Narnoor mandal to verify the movement of a tiger.

The question remained how the same tiger can be seen at two separate places at the same time. Forest officials show the pugmarks only, but not the pictures of the said tigers. Questions are asked as to why the tigers are not recorded on trap

Residents demand action against suspected land grab bid

The residents, members of Ravindranagar Colony Welfare Association, demanded an order copy and identity cards from the demolition squad, but they refused to provide any. When Keerthan, association general secretary, the squad left the place.

The colony, which houses around 500 houses, was developed in late 1990s as per the norms of the erstwhile Hyderabad Urban Development Authority (Huda).

The common area, which was left out as per norms, was initially developed into a park and in 2020 as a

shuttle badminton court, said Prof. Uma Maheshwar Reddy, a resident of the colony.

Apartments in the illegal demolition attempt. "They wanted to demolish the wall and encroach the ground."

G. Krishna Mohan Reddy who is the association's treasurer, "The Sri Hari Nivas Apartment owners

are denying any role. We have lodged a complaint with the Osmania University police station house officer, municipal corporator and the GHMC zonal commissioner."

According to S . Madhusudhan Reddy, another resident, "GHMC spent around ₹14 lakh, just before the Assembly election.

From 5.30 am onwards, residents take active part in fitness activities. Officials should hunt the culprits and punish them."

Speaking to *Deccan Chronicle*, Osmania University police SHO N. Rajender said, "During our primary investigation, the residents accused Sri Hari Nivas Apartment owners of trying to remove the fence of this park, so that the ground can be used by them. We are also trying to find out the identity of those who came with JCB and other machinery. As the investigation is still on, we cannot come to any conclusion."

BRS files plaint with ED against CM's kin

According to the SP, Suresh confessed that he had orchestrated the attack that occurred on November 11, driven by the motive to obstruct a public hearing on land acquisition for the purpose of establishing a pharmaceutical company. Prime accused, BRS former legislator Patnam Narender Reddy, and 25 others have been arrested in the case so far.

Police said that Suresh, despite knowing the farmers were in an agitated mood,

requested the collector to visit the village. Suresh's passport has been seized. As he was at large after the attack and before the arrest, a look out notice was issued against him.

"There were 84 calls between Narender Reddy and Suresh in the past month. When we recovered them all, it was found that the two had orchestrated this. Narender Reddy has confessed to the us. We are left with a few more procedures to finish with regard to him," the SP said.

The group had attacked, apart from the Vikarabad collector, the additional collector, Kodangal Area Development Authority (KADA) special officer, the tahsildar and other revenue officials. Narender Reddy is in judicial remand.

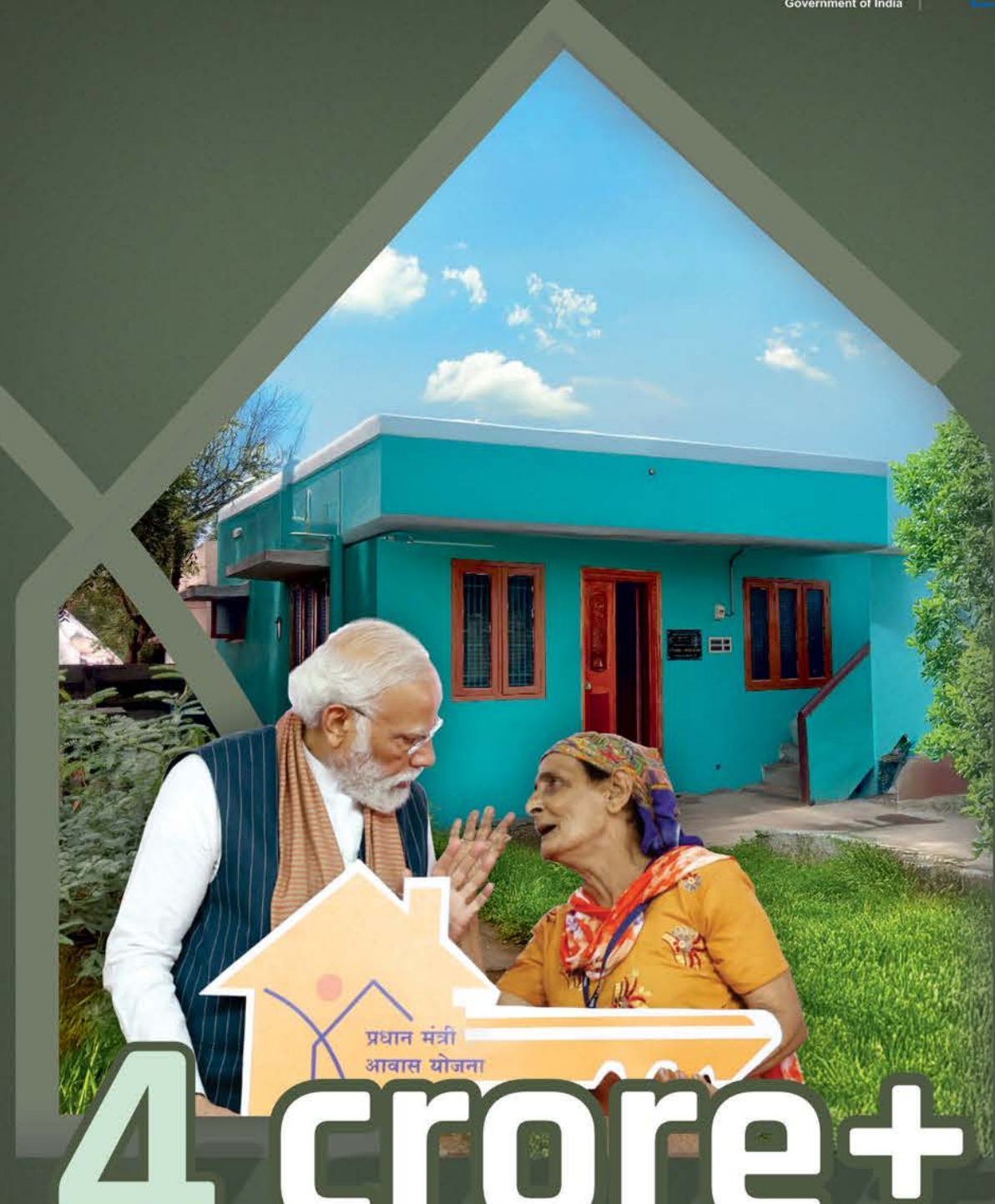

Delhi-NCR air too toxic to breathe, but govts dither

Delhi's air in winter is injurious to health. With an Air Quality Index nearing 500, even breathing in Delhi has become hazardous. In the old days, people visiting India would be advised, gratuitously of course, not to drink the water or breathe the air. Today's air over the region, including Gurugram, Noida and Faridabad, is smothered in a pea soup fog that hangs like a malevolent blanket, so much so people are being advised to stay indoors on days of poor AQI.

Emergency responses have seen the closing of schools, people working from home and regulations imposed inhibiting normal life as the geographical and meteorological conditions of the winter season take over to affect the weather pattern with a foul fog because of which even trains struggle and flights get routinely rerouted.

When there was a pressing need for action on a war footing to mitigate or try to stave off the crisis that grips New Delhi and many parts of north India every year starting in November, the governments of Delhi and the Centre and of many adjoining states have not been seen to be proactive. They have done little about helping people breathe air that is tolerable, and which can support life in people with medical conditions while not incommoding normal persons.

The political blame game, however, creates only din of the kind that people have become inured to as netas point fingers at each other. Truth to tell, the burning of stubble is a national problem about which not enough has been done to find alternatives like changing cropping patterns. Some states like Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan may have contributed their share to exacerbate this problem by being blasé about it while Punjab and Haryana have at least taken some measures to control it.

The problem is, however, larger than crop burning which is only one contributing factor. Giving up construction and demolitions may be tough to do in a country that is an eternal work in progress, but rules must be adhered to if such activity is not to add to the existing dust and vehicle pollution from transporting people and goods. It will take years anyway to phase out the more polluting older vehicles, but leaders do swear by half-measures like odd and even number plates on alternate days.

The Supreme Court was incensed at the lackadaisical attitude of governments towards handling this recurring crisis until the problem of severe air pollution peaks in November-December when crop burning adds to it because of the timing of harvests. The fact of the matter is that it won't go away until a national effort is coordinated by the Centre and the states follow a host of regulations lest they leave a sizeable population of the country gasping for air and millions risk dying prematurely.

The people can contribute by taking public transportation or car-pooling and the Delhi government can help by not letting solid waste burn and regulating better the incineration of waste in unscientific manners through private industry. So long as blaming everyone but themselves and passing the buck are national pastimes of leaders, the state of the capital will be like this in its unbeautiful cloak of winter. Governments must act round the year to control the conditions that lead to foggy winters and people must wake up, too, and help.

Maha poll race hits a new low

Winning the Maharashtra Assembly elections is an important target for both the BJP and the Congress and their respective alliances in the state and hence it is only expected of them to use all legitimate tools at their disposal to achieve that target. The state hosts the nation's financial capital and sends the second largest contingent of members to the Rajya Sabha, which are reasons enough for a political formation to go the whole hog. The lists of freebies both the fronts have liberally promised the voters have their roots in this desperation to win. But the patently divisive agenda on which the BJP-led Mahayuti has built its campaign in the final phase and the way its national leaders have run it offer a poor comment on their agenda.

It's not because Maharashtra has its own problems to be solved that the saffron alliance took recourse to a communal agenda. The state has been witnessing rural distress in its worst form for decades. A political party willing to show sympathy to the farming community can, therefore, have the people's ear. There is a quota issue which is yet to be settled, and crop failures and unremunerative prices have triggered farmer suicides on a scale not seen in other states. And unemployment, like most other states, is hopelessly high in Maharashtra as well.

But the proponents of the "double engine government" have had other ideas. And slogans like "*Ek hai to safe hai* (united we are safe)", "*batenge to katenge* (divided we fall)" and "*dharma yudh* (war of faith)". These were introduced and propagated by senior BJP leaders including Uttar Pradesh CM Yogi Adityanath, but do nothing except pit one section of the population against another. That is so un-Maharashtrian that even Mahayuti alliance partners stayed away from them.

There is a *laxmanrekha* in every *yudh*, *dharma yudh* included. Victories will taste better when they are won by adhering to the rules of the battlefield.

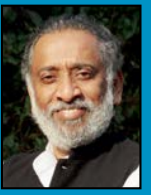

Extension raj in PESB, Lok Sabha secretariat... Will RBI come next?

Since its second term, the Narendra Modi government has retained top civil servants beyond retirement for "continuity in policy-making". Weeks after being voted back to power, the Narendra Modi government extended the tenure of Intelligence Bureau (IB) chief Tapan Kumar Deka. In addition, the government also reappointed Amit Khare and Tarun Kapoor as advisers to the PM, giving a firm message of continuity in the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) in the Modi government's third term, albeit in coalition with other parties this time. Rajesh Kotecha, secretary in the AYUSH ministry since 2017, also got his third extension since his appointment.

Clearly, the government's penchant for extensions to top officials continues. Senior IAS Utpal Kumar Singh, the incumbent secretary-general of Lok Sabha (Secretariat), has reportedly been given another one-year extension. Singh's term was expected to end this month. Further, Mallika Srinivasan, chairperson of the Public Enterprises Selection Board (PESB), received an extension just days before retiring, allowing her to continue until November 2025. Srinivasan's leadership has been pivotal in steering the PESB, and the extension suggests confidence in her steady approach.

Meanwhile, a similar question hangs over Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor Shaktikanta Das as his six-year term winds down on December 10. Under

Das' watch, the RBI has navigated major economic hurdles, including the pandemic, while holding interest rates steady for nearly two years despite calls for easing. His continuity could provide stability amid a tough economic climate, and while speculation points towards an extension, there's no official word yet. The appointments committee of the Cabinet, led by Prime Minister Modi and home minister Amit Shah, holds the decision.

Adding to the intrigue, RBI deputy governor Michael Patra's term ends in January. Observers agree that a leadership change, whether Das or Patra, might impact the RBI's approach to interest rates, particularly given Das' consistent control over inflation.

MBA BABUS? NARAYAN MURTHY'S BOLD FIX
So, after urging India's youth to embrace the charms of a 70-hour work week, Infosys co-founder NR Narayana Murthy has now set his sights on the world of Indian bureaucracy. His latest brainstorm? Recruit IAS and IPS officers from top business schools instead of relying solely on the tried-and-tested UPSC exams. Because, of course, India's civil servants need a crash course in "management mindset" to catapult us towards that elusive \$50 trillion economy by 2047.

Murthy's pitch is intriguing: Bring in leaders trained to chase KPIs, crunch numbers, and wield

PowerPoints. After all, if corporate leadership can steer billion-dollar enterprises, why can't it give a little corporate shine to the business of governance? Murthy argues that while our government machinery, bless its bureaucratic heart, remains tethered to the status quo, business leaders are wired to "aspire". Imagine that — babus with business plans!

On the one hand, Murthy's timing couldn't be better. As Modi's government pushes for economic reform and modernisation, Murthy believes a dose of management mojo could shake things up. He even suggested that civil servants should get tailored business training before tackling sectors like agriculture, defence, or manufacturing. The idea of sector-specific management boot camps sounds appealing, but will our traditionalist babus, who've already endured UPSC's gauntlet, agree?

OF SAMOSAS AND SOCIAL MEDIA SPATS
When it comes to governance quirks, Himachal Pradesh and Kerala both seem to offer plenty of comic relief. In Himachal, the case of Baddi SP Ilma Afroz, an earnest IPS officer who left a prestigious UN job to serve her country, stands out. Her transgression? Daring to issue a fine to vehicles linked to the family of MLA Ram Kumar Chaudhary for alleged illegal mining activities. The response was swift: A breach of privilege motion in the Assembly and an enforced "vacation". Here, apparently, refus-

ing to bend the rules in favour of political connections can send you on indefinite leave. But, hey, when you have investigations into the CM's missing samosas to prioritise, keeping hard-working officers on duty isn't exactly urgent.

Meanwhile, Kerala's governance drama recently unfolded on social media, with two IAS officers finding themselves suspended after an online spat. The saga began when K. Gopalakrishnan formed a WhatsApp group called "Mallu Hindu Officers" that included senior Hindu IAS officials. The group was quickly deleted, but the controversy was just warming up. Another officer, N. Prasanth, aired grievances against senior official A. Jayathilak through a series of posts, triggering a very public spectacle. Chief minister Pinarayi Vijayan and Chief Secretary Sarada Muralaeddharan acted promptly, putting both officers on ice to cool off. With one state busy issuing leaves to honest officers and the other quelling social media feuds among babus, one wonders if the real challenges of governance could be taken half as seriously as these diversions. But why tackle hard issues when you can deal with "missing savouries" or a rogue WhatsApp group?

India's hopes, fears rise as Trump picks 'dream team'

Thanks to China, India has reason not to be displeased with the initial list of members of US President-elect Donald Trump's Cabinet. While Marco Rubio and Mike Waltz, respectively nominated as secretary of state and national security adviser, favour more abiding security ties with India, the highly individualistic new Director of National Intelligence, Tulsi Gabbard, might leave the President-elect's grand vision of American might with an element of human concern that has nothing to do with propping up an adversary of China's.

Florida's Senator Rubio presided over the 2023 Defence Cooperation Act to widen and deepen the strategic partnership between India and the United States. Waltz is head of the India Caucus in the US Congress. Gabbard, the American Samoa-born daughter of a white American couple from Hawaii who embraced Hinduism and raised their children in the faith, is a life-long vegetarian.

Gabbard swore her oath to enter Congress — she was then a Democrat — on a copy of the *Bhagavad Gita* which she later presented to Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

"I know Tulsi will bring the fearless spirit that has defined her illustrious career to our intelligence community" Trump announced about the 43-year-old first Hindu Congresswoman in the US. Although with limited experience of intelligence operations, Gabbard brings military experience to the job, having served in the Army National Guard for over two decades with deployments to Iraq and Kuwait.

Meanwhile, "the Great Elon Musk" and "American Patriot Vivek Ramaswamy" — both basking in encomiums bestowed on them by the President-elect — and heading the new Depart-

ment of Government Efficiency (DOGE), will help Trump to "dismantle government bureaucracy, slash excess regulations, cut wasteful expenditures, and restructure federal agencies" to realise his dreams.

The Office of American Innovation was supposed to do this last time. But no President is omnipotent. Trump will need cooperative colleagues and skilful Speakers to get round the procedural complexities of both chambers to make a success of DOGE.

Even so, in achieving the "America First" agenda, Trump's "dream team" rooted in personal loyalty, policy alignment and shared priorities may not please all friends and allies. US trade officials cannot approve of China's tactic of flooding the world with cheap manufactures.

The nomination as attorney-general of the Florida Congressman, Matt Gaetz, who resigned after allegations of misconduct, including paid sex with a minor, which he denies, have shocked even Republicans. India's unmentioned agenda of sending lakhs of emigrants to grab as many "Green Cards" as they can might feel thwarted by the anti-H-1B Stephen Miller, deputy chief of staff for policy, and Tom Homan, the new "border czar".

Indians who feel victimised can turn to Gabbard who has picked up the cudgels for them more than once in her past career. Shortly after being elected co-chair of the India Caucus in 2017, she talked about how Pakistan continued to allow its territory to be used by terrorists in India, Afghanistan and elsewhere. "In Congress, I've worked to cut back US assistance for Pakistan, particularly any military assistance, and increase pressure on Pakistan to stop these dangerous actions and break these ties", she explained.

The Stop Arming Terrorists Act that she

embracing Trump's policies on immigration and foreign relations. With his expertise as vice-chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee and member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, and given his hawkish views on China, Cuba, and Iran, Rubio could play a central role in advancing Trump's foreign policy goals.

Others of consequence include Fox News's Pete Hegseth, now nominated secretary of defence, an Army National Guard veteran with combat experience of Iraq and Afghanistan; South Dakota's plucky Governor Kristi Noem who will be secretary of homeland security; and the "tough, smart, innovative, and universally admired and respected" (quoting Trump) Susie Wiles, who refused to implement Covid-19 restrictions, and will be White House chief of staff with a pivotal role in shaping Trump's foreign policy strategy and overseeing border security.

The two remaining mysteries are the incoming administration's stand on Russia's February 2022 invasion of Ukraine and the Israeli belligerence in West Asia. The world is waiting for the President-elect to demonstrate his readiness and ability to bring peace to Ukraine. At the same time, the former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee, selected as ambassador to Israel, is a staunch defender of the Zionist state and opponent of a two-state solution, advocating instead de facto Israeli absorption of the entire region.

Trump's intentions might become clearer when the dark horse in his stable, his son-in-law, Jared Kushner, said to be as close to Saudi Arabia's real ruler, Crown Prince Md bin Salman al Saud, as he is to Zionist extremism, emerges into the light of decision-making. Last time around the OAI under Kushner failed to make much headway. There are fears that DOGE might go the same way. If so, Indian-Americans at least can turn to Tulsi Gabbard. Rules permitting, her native Hawaii's Aloha spirit won't let them down.

ISB, IIT-DELHI TIE UP TO LAUNCH NEW CENTRE

TG TO UTILISE UNUSED LANDS TO ATTRACT FIRMS

Other major unutilised land holdings include Ordnance Factory, Medak, having 2,000 acres unused, BHEL, Lingampally, 2,125 acres, ECIL, Cherlapally, 930 acres, HAL, Balanagar, 214 acres, DRDO and DRDL, Chandrayangutta, 55 acres. Additionally, three defunct PSUs - Cement Corporation of India (CCI) in Adilabad, Indian Drugs and Pharmaceutical Ltd (IDPL) in Balanagar, and Hindustan Machine Tools (HMT) in Quthbullapur - hold 2,290 acres, 891 acres, and 123 acres, respectively.

Official sources said that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has instructed officials to engage with the concerned Union ministries to reclaim these land parcels. The state argues that these parcels were allotted at nominal or zero cost to support industrial growth and employment generation.

With Hyderabad facing a severe shortage of industrial land, the state government intends to repurpose the unutilised parcels to attract new industries. However, discussions with the Centre have hit a roadblock, as Union ministries are reportedly demanding market rates for the land. The state is seeking a compromise, urging the Centre to either return the lands free of cost or sell them at the government-assessed value instead of market prices.

While the state government is keen on facilitating industrial development through these lands, it remains unclear whether the Centre will adhere to its request. Official sources revealed that the lands' open-market valuation exceeds ₹40,000 crore, significantly higher than the government-prescribed valuation of ₹6,000 crore.

Over the past month, the orphanage's staff observed the behaviour of Balayya's daughters to ensure that they were capable and prepared to

take care of him.

After having satisfied themselves about the sincerity of Balayya's daughters, the orphanage staff took them to their father when they returned to the shelter for another donation event. The reunion was deeply emotional.

Speaking to *Deccan Chronicle*, Matrudevobhava orphanage's founder Gattu Giri said: "We found Balayya roaming near the temple. So we got him to our orphanage at Nadergul. Immediately, we uploaded his picture and details to the Rachakonda police station." "His daughters, who are both married, told us that he used to regularly leave home and come back. Six years ago when he left, they assumed he'd

come back and didn't even file a police complaint," Giri said.

"We help people who are mentally unstable or who cannot take care of themselves by bringing them under one roof and making sure their basic necessities are met. I have a private business, and I spend about 30 per cent of my earnings on the orphanage. Along with that, other people also donate money to the orphanage during their special occasions like birthdays and anniversaries," Giri added. "As the video went viral, many people began contacting the daughters, causing them distress. We took down the videos as well, to prevent causing them further hardship," he said.

UoH students protest, want no moral policing

The University of Hyderabad is facing student-led protests over what has been termed as "moral policing" and invasive practices by the chief warden's flying squad. On November 18, unannounced raids were conducted at Men's Hostel F, with reports of forceful entry into rooms by the flying squad, accompanied by security personnel, and the videographing of students without their consent.

The Students' Federation of India (SFI), which has condemned the infringement of privacy and accused the administration of oppressive conduct.

According to student representatives, five students were arbitrarily fined amounts ranging from ₹10,000 to ₹30,000 for violations such as using kettles and induc-

tion cookers in their, a rule students claim is based on a hostel rulebook that was rejected by the general body in 2019.

The SFI has decried these measures as a diversionary tactic by chief warden Svashisa Rana, alleging that he had failed to address more pressing issues like declining food quality, increasing mess fees, and the lack of essential facilities such as hot water dispensers and common kitchens.

One student recounted an incident where a physically challenged boarder, unable to visit the mess, was subjected to video recording by the squad even when he was partially dressed. Another case involved a student engaging in a study session with a female friend, where male staff of the warden's team allegedly barged in and recorded videos.

"Invading students' privacy under the guise of rule enforcement is unac-

ceptable. The chief warden's conduct is inhumane," said another student.

The raids were temporarily halted following strong resistance and protests from the students. University registrar Dvesh Nigam told the students that further raids and fines would be suspended pending review.

University officials noted that students had been given an opportunity to address their grievances. "While students have been asked by the chief warden to file a representation at his office to reconsider any fines they believe are unfair, most have not taken this step," stated a university official. The receipt of fines showed that the students were in possession of even "banned substances" and "unauthorised boarders" in the hostels.

"Students deserve dignity, not surveillance," declared Mohit G., an SFI member.

Footpath encroachment case goes to HC

Justice K. Lakshman of the Telangana High Court will hear a writ plea challenging the alleged illegal construction on a public footpath affecting his business. The judge was dealing with a writ plea filed by Mohammed Akbar from Osmania Bazaar who alleged that neighbouring Moradabad Metal House had demolished a footpath in front of their shop to construct walls and shutters, encroaching on public space. The petitioner stated that despite filing complaints with the GHMC and an FIR with Charminar police, no action was taken. Photographic evidence, was submitted to the court. Senior counsel M.V.S. Suresh Kumar, counsel for the petitioner, urged the

court to direct GHMC to remove the encroachment and restore the footpath for public use. The government pleader for GHMC sought time to seek instructions. The judge wanted counsel to find out from the authorities what action was taken on the representations made by the petitioner

HC ORDERS JOURNO SOCIETY POLLS

The Telangana High Court directed the State Co-operative Election Authority to conduct elections for the Journalists Cooperative Housing Society Ltd within two months. A two-judge panel comprising Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice J. Sreenivas Rao was dealing with two writ appeals filed by G. Guruvu Reddy and another. Earlier, two writ petitions were



filed by P. Janga Reddy and 237 others inter alia seeking elections by including in the voters list, the names of the petitioners and the members who were admitted between 2002 and 2020. The case of the petitioners was that as per the admission register of the society, it had enrolled 2,554 members, however, as per a report by a three-member committee report, only 890 were admitted against the directions issued by the Commissioner for Coop-

eration and Registrar of Cooperative Societies under Section 4(2) of the Act, 1964. The petitioners argued that they were on the list of admitted members prepared between 2002 and 2020 but, according to the official respondents, their enrolment was contrary to the Act. The petitioners said that their membership could not be invalidated based on the report of the three-member committee. A single judge directed the State Cooperative Election Authority to verify the records and finalise the voters list with the assistance of the deputy registrar of cooperative societies without involving the other respondents and without being influenced by the report of the three-member committee. The appellants argued that the respon-

dents were accused of attempting to gain voting rights despite the lack of available plots, which is contrary to a direction issued under Section 4(2) of the Act. It was argued that despite being aware of their ineligibility, the petitioners attempted to gain entry into the voters list. The panel modified the order of the single judge and expunged the direction pertaining to finalisation of the voter list without being influenced by the report of the three-member committee.

HC JUNKS ENGINEER PLEA IN GRAFT CASE

Justice K. Surender confirmed the sentence against a former additional assistant engineer (operations) in APCPDCL, in a bribery case. The case of the prose-

cution before the Additional Special Judge for SPE & ACB cases, Hyderabad, was that the accused demanded a bribe of ₹2,000 and later reduced it to ₹1,000. A trap was laid. PW1 handed over the amount to the appellant. The special judge refused to accept the defence of the appellant that the amount was towards development charges. Justice Surender said that in view of the defence taken by the appellant, that the amount was towards development, the burden shifted onto the appellant to substantiate his version. The judge found that there was proof of demand and payment and added that the prosecution had proved that the appellant demanded and accepted the bribe amount.

TOP NAXAL SHOT DEAD IN KARNATAKA

Karnataka's top Naxal leader Vikram Gowda, alias Srikanth (46), was killed in an encounter with the Anti-Naxal Force (ANF) on Monday evening at Kabbinala, close to his native village Nadpal. State home minister G. Parameshwara said the ANF had been looking to apprehend Vikram Gowda for about 20 years.

According to inspector-general of police (IGP), Internal Security, D. Roopa Moudgil, Gowda used to lead the 'Kabini 2' group of the Naxalites. There were 61 cases against him, including that of murder and extortion, in Karnataka, and 19 cases in Kerala, she told reporters. Describing him as a "dreaded naxal", Parameshwara said he had escaped several times, including during "encounters" in the past.

MODI, SHAH TO ATTEND DGPs MEET IN ODISHA

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union home minister Amit Shah will attend the All India three-day conference of Directors General and Inspectors General of Police 2024 to commence on November 29 in Odisha. A formal announcement from the Odisha government is expected soon.

The conference will feature deliberations on critical and futuristic themes in policing and national security. Key topics include combating cyber-crime, integrating advanced technology into policing, addressing counter-terrorism challenges, tackling left-wing extremism, implementing prison reforms, and more.

Odisha Director General of Police (DGP) Y.B. Khurania earlier announced that the event would run from November 29 to December 1 in Bhubaneswar.

SPACEX LAUNCHES ISRO'S 4,700 KG SATELLITE

Bengaluru, Nov. 19: The country's latest communication satellite, GSAT-N2 was successfully launched by billionaire Elon Musk-founded SpaceX from Cape Canaveral in the US, Isro's commercial arm NSIL has said.

The communication satellite will enhance broadband services and in-flight connectivity across the Indian region, NewSpace India Limited (NSIL) said.

As the satellite was heavier than Isro's current launch capabilities, it had to opt for a foreign launch vehicle, top space scientists and former chiefs of the country's space agency said.

Speaking to mediapersons, former Isro chairperson K. Sivan said, "the satellite was a heavier one beyond the capability of Isro launch vehicles, that's why it has gone outside."

The 4,700kg GSAT-N2 High-throughput (HTS) satellite onboard a Falcon 9 rocket was injected into the desired orbit.

RAPE CASE: SC GRANTS BAIL TO ACTOR SIDDIQUE

New Delhi, Nov. 19: In a relief to veteran Malayalam actor Siddique, the Supreme Court on Tuesday granted him anticipatory bail in a rape case.

A bench of Justices Bela M. Trivedi and Satish Chandra Sharma said the veteran actor will have to deposit his passport and cooperate with the investigating officer in the probe.

The top court also took note of the fact that the complaint in the case was filed in August, eight years after the alleged incident took place in 2016.

"We deem it appropriate not to assign elaborate reasons, particularly considering the sensitivity of the case.

Questioning the complainant over the delay in lodging the complaint, the bench said, "She had the courage to make a post on Facebook in 2021 but could not go to police and lodge an FIR."

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Siddique, contended that his reputation is being tarnished and that he has not met the complainant since 2016.

Cong. mocks Modi in cash-for-vote drama

BJP's note jihad for votes, Uddhav takes a dig at Tawde

Senior Congress leaders Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi on Tuesday attacked Prime Minister Narendra Modi accusing the BJP of using money power in the Maharashtra polls, after a video surfaced in which party leader Vinod Tawde is being accused of distributing money to electors in Palghar on the eve of voting.

The Congress demanded the Election Commission take immediate action against the BJP leader.

"Modi Ji wants to make Maharashtra 'safe' with 'money power' and 'muscle power'! On one hand, there is a deadly attack on the former home minister (Anil Deshmukh) of the state, on the other hand, a senior BJP leader is caught red-handed with ₹5 crore in cash," Kharge said in a post in Hindi on X.

"The public will answer this by voting tomorrow," the Congress chief said.

Gandhi reposted a video posted by the Congress which allegedly showed money being distributed to voters in Palghar.

"Modiji, from whose SAFE did these 5 crores come from," he asked on X. "Who looted the public money and sent you in the tempo?" the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha said, referring to Modi's comments made during the Lok Sabha elections when he accused top businessmen of sending "tempos full of money" to the Congress top brass.

Meanwhile, Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Tuesday took a "note jihad" jibe amid allegations of a senior BJP leader distributing money hours before voting for the Maharashtra assembly elections begins.

SC QUESTIONS CENTRE ON DELAY IN DELIMITATION JOB IN ARUNACHAL

The Supreme Court on Tuesday raised concerns over the delay in carrying out the delimitation exercise in Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur and Assam, despite a 2020 presidential order rescinding the deferment of the process.

A bench comprising CJI Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Sanjay Kumar said "once the president rescinds the notification, that is enough" to proceed with the delimitation exercise. "Where does the government come in?"

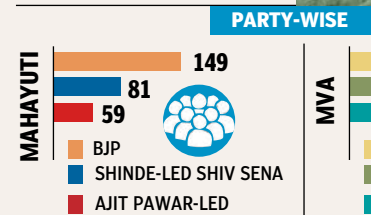
The bench asked Additional Solicitor General K. M. Natraj, appearing for the Centre, to take instructions on the future course of action on the matter. "Take instructions on this, the exercise has to be done it is a statutory mandate and therefore you have to comply with it, the CJI said.

The police registered two FIRs against Tawde and around 250 BJP workers in connection with the alleged cash distribution at the hotel in Virar. While the first FIR against Tawde is for violation of the election Model Code of Conduct "by distributing cash and liquor", the second FIR against him is for violation of Section 126 of the Representation of the People Act, an official said. Section 126 stipulates that no person shall convene, hold, attend, join or address any public meeting or procession in connection with an election during the period of 48 hours before the polling ends.

Tawde refuted the allegation and claimed he was

ambushed by BVA supporters as part of a planned conspiracy. Interestingly, the BVA accusations came on a day when BVA candidate Suresh Padvi contesting from the Dahanu Assembly seat joined the BJP and announced his withdrawal from the election.

After the ruckus of over three hours, BVA chief Hitendra Thakur, his son Kshitij, Tawde and Naik decided to hold a joint press conference to tell their sides of the story.

Shah: Govt brought down violence by 70 pc in 10 yrs

Gandhinagar, Nov. 19: Union home minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said the BJP-led government at the Centre has successfully brought down violence in Jammu and Kashmir, North-East and Naxal-hit areas by 70 per cent in the last 10 years. Speaking at the inaugural event of the 50th All India Police Conference (AIPSC) at the Rashtriya Raksha University here, he expressed confidence that the coming decade will make the Indian criminal justice system the most scientific and fastest in the world.

"For years, three regions were considered very disturbed — Kashmir, North East, and Naxalite-affected areas. We have made significant improvements in the security of all these three regions. Comparing the data of the last 10 years with the period before that shows that we have been successful in reducing violence by 70 per cent," Shah said.

"I believe this is a very big achievement. A large number of people have wholeheartedly supported the government's efforts to reduce violence," even in terms of controlling the narcotics trade, union minister said. — PTI

Members of various civil society organisations in Imphal West district continued to protest against the reimposition of AFSPA in parts of the state while in Churachandpur district, hundreds of people took to the streets with empty coffins, demanding justice for those killed in a gunfight with the security forces in Jiribam.

India, Italy unveil five-year strategic joint action plan

The bilateral talks with Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni saw announcement of a Joint Strategic Action Plan 2025-29 that "will pursue joint collaborations, programmes and initiatives in key sectors of trade and investment, science and technology, new and emerging technologies, clean energy, space, defence, connectivity and people-to-people linkages". New Delhi said the two leaders — who are also known to share a strong camaraderie — were "aware of the unparalleled potential of the India Italy Strategic partnership" and the two sides decided to "negotiate a Defence Industrial Roadmap and focus on co-production and co-development of defence platforms and equipment".

In his meeting with French President Emmanuel Macron, Modi "commended the progress achieved in bilateral cooperation, including in strategic areas such as defense, space and civil nuclear energy, and committed to accelerating it further with a view to reinforcing their shared commitment to strategic autonomy". The two leaders also reviewed the progress of cooperation on India's National Museum project which is being assisted by France.

Modi also had a bilateral meeting with G20 Summit host and Brazilian President Luis Inacio Lula Da Silva. "Held talks with President Lula during the G20 Summit in Rio de Janeiro. Complimented him on various efforts of Brazil during their G20 Presidency. We took stock of the full range of bilateral ties between our nations and reaffirmed our commitment to improving cooperation in sectors like energy, biofuels, defence, agriculture and more," Modi said.

He also had another bilateral meeting after that with the President of another South American nation, Chile. "Met the President of Chile Gabriel Boric Pont in Rio de Janeiro. India's ties with Chile are getting stronger across various sectors. Our talks focused on how to deepen relations in pharmaceuticals, technology, space and more. It is gladdening to see Ayurveda gaining popularity in Chile. This is also a sector where ties can gain momentum," Modi said. Modi also held his first meeting with the newly elected Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto during which the "two leaders reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening bilateral ties in the framework of their Comprehensive Strategic Partnership". Similarly, Modi also had his first meeting with his Portuguese counterpart Luis Montenegro.

Delhi urges London to extradite Mallya, Nirav

Rio de Janeiro, Nov. 19: India will open two new consulates in Belfast and Manchester in the UK, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced in the first meeting with his British counterpart Keir Starmer even as he called for extradition of fugitive Indian businessmen from the UK.

Following the talks, held on the sidelines of the G20 summit late on Monday, Starmer said the negotiations for an India-UK free trade pact will be relaunched in the new year, in remarks that appeared to dispel anxiety about his Labour government's approach to the proposed trade deal.

The Indian side pressed for extradition of fugitive

Indian businessmen Vijay Mallya and Nirav Modi with Modi underlining the importance of addressing the issue of economic offenders from India in the UK.

It was the first meeting between the two leaders after Starmer assumed charge as the UK prime minister in July succeeding Rishi Sunak.

On the ambitious trade deal, the two prime ministers hoped that a balanced, mutually beneficial and forward looking free trade agreement (FTA) will be firmed up while addressing remaining issues to mutual satisfaction, according to an Indian government readout. — PTI

India, China discuss new steps in relations

While no formal structured bilateral meeting has taken place as yet between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping on the sidelines of the G-20 summit in Rio, external affairs minister S. Jaishankar met Chinese foreign minister Wang Yi, who is a member of the politburo of the Communist Party of China, during which both foreign ministers "noted the progress in the recent disengagement in the India-China border areas". Both sides also discussed the "resumption of the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra pilgrimage, data sharing on trans-border rivers, direct flights between India and China and media exchanges", according to a statement issued by New Delhi on Tuesday evening.

The EAM also told the Chinese ministry clearly that India is "against unilateral approaches to

establish dominance", an obvious reference to border actions by the Chinese military four and a half years ago. "It was agreed that a meeting of the Special Representatives and of the Foreign Secretary-Vice Minister mechanism will take place soon," New Delhi said in its statement. It added: "The ministers 'recognised that the disengagement in our border areas had contributed to the maintenance of peace and tranquility. The discussions focused on the next steps in India-China relations... The two ministers felt that it was imperative that the focus should be on stabilising ties, managing differences and taking the next steps."

Putin to visit India next year

Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov on Tuesday was quoted saying that Russian President Vladimir Putin may visit India early next year. "We are looking forward to the visit. The dates will be mutually worked out soon," Peskov was quoted as saying in Moscow. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had visited

Russia twice within four months this year.

President Putin had last visited New Delhi about three years ago in December, 2021, before the outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine war in February, 2022. Modi had visited Moscow on a bilateral visit in July this year; his first to Russia since the outbreak of the conflict. He had visited Russia for the second time this year just last month to attend

the BRICS Summit in the city of Kazan.

Just last week, Russian First Deputy Prime Minister Denis Manturov had visited New Delhi and had held talks with external affairs minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar under the aegis of the 25th meeting of the India-Russia Intergovernmental Commission on trade, economic, scientific, technological and cultural cooperation (IRIGC-TEC).

Judges told to allow virtual hearings wherever possible in National Capital Region

Delhi govt wants cloud seeding, seeks PM's intervention

As a thick gray haze choked Delhi for the third consecutive day on Tuesday, with pollution levels remaining alarmingly high at 488 in the "severe plus" category, city environment minister Gopal Rai said he has written to Union environment minister Bhopender Yadav four times, seeking urgent clearances for cloud seed-

ing to artificially induce rain that could help combat the escalating pollution crisis.

Rai said, "It is disappointing that we received no response over the first letter we wrote to the Union environment minister on August 30 regarding cloud seeding to tackle this emergency. We wrote again on October 10 and then on October 23, but still no reply".

The minister also said a decision on implementing "work from home" measures and the "odd-even"

scheme will be taken soon to mitigate the crisis. Calling the current situation a medical emergency, Rai emphasised the need for collective action and urged the Centre to convene an emergency meeting to tackle worsening air quality.

He also asserted it was the moral responsibility of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to intervene in the matter. "People, including children and senior citizens, are struggling to breathe and we deeply regret this situation. This

is a time of medical emergency, and we all need to work together to address the situation," he added.

A day after the Supreme Court directed all NCR governments to ensure that GRAP-4 measures are implemented and stay in place till the AQI touches 300, Rai said the AAP government was monitoring the situation and will quickly decide on all possible preventive measures in the wake of toxic air pollution.

He said that significant restrictions on vehicles

under GRAP-4 have already been imposed. "We are analysing the impact of these measures. If the analysis shows a positive outcome, we will take further decisions," he added.

Meanwhile, Chief Justice Sanjay Khanna on Tuesday said all judges have been asked to allow virtual hearings wherever possible in view of the severe pollution levels in the national capital region.

Pollution is getting out of control, Sibal said.

BRAZILIAN COPS NAB FIVE IN PLOT TO KILL PREZ LULA

Brasilia, Sao Paulo, Nov. 19: Brazilian police on Tuesday arrested five people suspected of involvement in an alleged coup attempt in which they planned to kill then president-elect Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva and his vice-president weeks before they took office. Most of those investigated are military personnel with Special Forces training, the police said in a statement. "A detailed operational plan called 'Green and Yellow Dagger' was identified, which would be executed on December 15, 2022.

TWO BALTIC SEA CABLES CUT IN LAST 48 HOURS

Stockholm, Nov. 19: Two telecommunications cables cut in the Baltic Sea in 48 hours have prompted Nordic and German officials to say that they are suspecting "sabotage" and "hybrid warfare" stemming from Russia. On Monday, Finnish operator Cinia reported that the "C-Lion submarine cable" connecting Helsinki and the German port of Rostock had been cut for unknown reasons. The break was traced to a location south of the island of Oland in Swedish waters, some 700 km (435 miles) from Helsinki.

CHINA CAR HITS CROWD, MANY CHILDREN HURT

Beijing, Nov. 19: Several children were injured when an SUV rammed into groups of parents and students outside a primary school in China's Hunan province on Tuesday, the third incident of killing of civilians within a fortnight in the country. The incident took place in Changde city at around 7:30 am local time. The casualty count is not clear and authorities are yet to clarify if it was an accident or a deliberate attack. According to the state-run Xinhua news agency, the injured have been rushed to a hospital. Further investigation is underway.

TRUMP SAYS HE'S NAMING DUFFY AS TRANSPORT SECY

West Palm Beach, Nov. 19: President-elect Donald Trump said he is naming former Wisconsin Rep Sean Duffy as his nominee to be transportation secretary, as he continues to roll out picks for his Cabinet. Trump said in a statement, "Sean will use his experience and the relationships he has built to maintain and rebuild our Nation's Infrastructure, and fulfil our Mission of ushering in The Golden Age of Travel, focusing on Safety, Efficiency, and Innovation." He added, "Importantly, he will greatly elevate the Travel Experience for all Americans!" Duffy left Congress in 2019, and is now co-host of a show on Fox Business, the "Bottom Line". Before beginning his political career, he appeared on the MTV reality show "The Real World".

Climate negotiators seek to break COP29 impasse

Baku, Nov. 19: Negotiators sought on Tuesday to break a deadlock at UN climate talks after G20 leaders backed the need for "trillions" of dollars for poorer countries but left key sticking points unresolved. Ministers at the COP29 conference in Azerbaijan had been eagerly waiting for the G20 meeting in Rio de Janeiro to issue a declaration that might jump-start the stalled negotiations. While the lack of a phrase calling for "transitioning away from fossil fuels" disappointed activists, the statement on climate finance was cautiously welcomed at the sports stadium hosting the talks. "G20 delegations now have their marching orders for here in Baku," UN climate chief Simon Stiell said. "We urgently need all nations to bypass the posturing and move swiftly towards common ground, across all issues," the climate chief said. — AFP

HELP RESOLVE ISSUE OF EU TARIFFS ON CHINESE EVs, XI URGES SCHOLZ

Rio de Janeiro, Nov. 19: Chinese President Xi Jinping told German Chancellor Olaf Scholz on Tuesday he hopes Germany can help Europe and China resolve the issue of tariffs on Chinese electric vehicles as soon as possible. Xi said China is ready to work with Germany to consolidate an overall strategic partnership, before bringing up European Union tariffs on Chinese-made electric vehicles, a major contentious issue in the EU-China ties. — Reuters

Kyiv fires US missiles, Putin lowers mark for nukes' use

Ukraine fires ATACMS missile on 1,000th day of war

Moscow, Nov. 19: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday lowered the threshold for a nuclear strike in response to a broader range of conventional attacks, and Moscow said Ukraine had struck deep inside Russia with US-made ATACMS long-range missiles.

Russia's military said on Tuesday that Ukraine fired US-supplied long-range missiles at a military facility in the Bryansk border region, in what would be the first attack since Washington authorised the use of its weapons. "At 03:25 am (0025 GMT), the enemy struck a site in the Bryansk region with six ballistic missiles. According to confirmed data, US-made ATACMS tactical missiles were used," the defence ministry said. Ukraine had for months been demanding that Washington let it use the longer-range ATACMS missiles to hit sites on Russian territory. Putin approved the change days after two US officials and a source familiar with the decision said on Sunday that US President Joe Biden's administration allowed Ukraine to use US-made weapons to strike deep into Russia.

Russia had been warning the West for months that if Washington allowed Ukraine to fire United States, British and French missiles deep into Russia, Moscow would consider those Nato members to be directly involved in the war in Ukraine. The updated Russian nuclear doctrine, establishing a framework for conditions under which Putin could order a strike from the world's biggest nuclear arsenal, was approved by him on Tuesday, according to a

published decree. Analysts said that the biggest change was that Russia could consider a nuclear strike in response to a conventional attack on Russia or its ally Belarus that "created a critical threat to their sovereignty and (or) their territorial integrity". "The big picture is that Russia is lowering the threshold for a nuclear strike in response to a possible conventional attack," said Alexander Graef, a senior researcher at the Institute for Peace Research and Security Policy at the University of Hamburg. The previous doctrine, contained in a 2020 decree, said Russia may use nuclear weapons in case of a nuclear attack by an enemy or a conventional attack that threatened the state's existence. The United States National Security Council said it had not seen any reason to adjust the United States nuclear posture. — Agencies

2025 will decide victor: Zelenskyy

Kyiv, Nov. 19: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said on Tuesday that 2025 will be decisive in determining who wins the war, in an address to Parliament on the 1,000th day of the Russian invasion.

Zelenskyy, presenting a "resilience plan" to Ukraine with the war at a decisive moment, spoke after Washington gave Kyiv a long-awaited approval to fire US missiles into Russian territory. "In the decisive moments — and they are coming next year — we must not allow anyone in the world to doubt the resilience of our entire state. And at this stage, it is being decided who will prevail," Zelenskyy told Ukrainian lawmakers. "This battle is not only about Pokrovsk,

Kupiansk or any other city, town or village, not only about this or that region of ours. This battle is about the whole of Ukraine, the battle is about the whole of Europe, about order or chaos for the whole world," he said. Moscow has significantly ramped up aerial attacks on the Ukrainian cities ahead of winter. — AFP

US envoy: Opportunity to end Israel-Hezbollah war

Beirut, Nov. 19: A senior US mediator said on Tuesday there was a "real opportunity" to end the conflict between Israel and Hezbollah and that gaps were narrowing, signalling progress in Washington's efforts to clinch a ceasefire. White House envoy Amos Hochstein spoke in Beirut after talks with Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri, a day after the Lebanese government and Iran-backed Hezbollah agreed to a US truce proposal, albeit with some comments on the content. "I came back because we have a real opportunity to bring this conflict to an end," Hochstein said at a press conference after the

meeting. "It is now within our grasp. As the window is now, I hope the coming days yield a resolute decision." Hochstein's mission marks a last-ditch attempt by the outgoing US administration to clinch a ceasefire as diplomacy to end the Gaza war appears totally adrift. Israeli energy minister Eli Cohen said "there are talks regarding an arrangement with Lebanon" but reiterated that Israel would only agree if all its demands were met, including pushing Hezbollah away from the border. The diplomatic efforts coincide with an intensification of the war, with Israel stepping up its str-

ikes on Beirut's Hezbollah-controlled southern suburbs and striking three times in the capital in the last three days. The conflict spiralled into all-out war in September when Israel went on the offensive, pounding wide areas of Lebanon with airstrikes, sending troops into the south, and killing many Hezbollah heads, including its leader Hassan Nasrallah. Hochstein, who has tried and failed to broker a truce several times over the last year, said "this is a moment of decision-making", but added "it's ultimately the decision of the parties to reach a conclusion to this conflict." — Reuters

Tomatoes, onions, gold fuel retail inflation: CEA

Chief Economic Adviser (CEA) V. Anantha Nageswaran on Tuesday stated that the recent rise in Consumer Price Index (CPI)-based retail inflation is primarily driven by a select few commodities. Nageswaran explained that excluding tomatoes, onions, potatoes, and gold and silver from the CPI calculation reveals a much lower headline inflation rate of just 4.2 per cent for October.

While these items together account for only 3.4 per cent of the total CPI basket, they contribute more than one-third of the 6.2 per cent inflation rate recorded for the month.

Speaking at the State Bank of India's (SBI) Annual Business and Economic Conclave, Nageswaran said, “We know that CPI is heavily influenced by a few commodities. If you exclude tomatoes, onions, potatoes, gold, and silver, the headline CPI rate is 4.2 per cent. These items, which constitute a 3.4 per cent

weight in the CPI basket, collectively account for more than one-third of the 6.2 per cent inflation rate observed in October.”

In the Economic Survey, the CEA had proposed that India's inflation-targeting framework should exclude food inflation, given its unique drivers.

He argued that monetary policy is primarily a short-term tool for managing aggregate demand and

is not well-suited to address supply-side shocks. Since food inflation is largely driven by such supply shocks, it should be considered separately.

However, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das believes that due to the significant share of food in the consumption basket, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) cannot overlook food inflation.

Air pollution hits 20% Delhi trade

Air pollution in Delhi has led to an estimated 20 per cent loss in trade, according to a traders' body.

Rising pollution levels are deterring consumers from venturing out, especially in crowded markets, leading to a significant decline in footfall. Measures such as odd-even schemes and curbs on vehicular movement reduce accessibility to commercial areas, directly affecting businesses. Restrictions on diesel vehicles, including trucks, disrupt supply chains, delay the transportation of goods to markets, and increase logistical costs, according to the Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT).

Micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in key commercial areas are experiencing sharp revenue declines due to reduced customer visits and supply chain issues. Festival and wedding sales are also facing heavy losses, as pollution curbs often coincide with peak sales periods. Businesses incur additional costs for air purifiers, masks, and other measures to ensure safer environments for employees and customers.

Health problems caused by pollution have resulted in reduced workforce efficiency and absenteeism, further affecting productivity. Migrant labourers, who form a significant part of Delhi's workforce, are also leaving the city due to deteriorating living conditions, the report stated.

According to a recent report by the Asian Development Bank, India is projected to witness a 24.7 per cent loss of gross domestic product (GDP) due to climate change by 2070.



Global funds eye India IPOs

Mumbai, Nov. 19: Foreign investors are pulling record sums from Indian shares since October and piling into initial public offerings in search for better returns.

Their primary market purchases, including IPOs and preferential share sales, hit \$11.5 billion this year, surpassing the previous record set in 2021, according to data published by Central Depository Services Ltd. In contrast, global funds have sold more than \$13 billion on the exchanges, helping send the main NSE Nifty 50 index into correction.

“Foreign investors are investing in new papers since they have the ability



to generate returns at a much faster pace,” said Devan Choksey, managing director at DRChoksey FinServ. “Selling in the secondary market, meanwhile, is driven by expensive valuations.”

Banks must offer options in insurance: IRDAI chief

Regulator asks people to use digital platform Bima Sugam

A day after finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman flagged concerns about the mis-selling of insurance products by banks, the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) chairman Debasish Panda on Tuesday emphasised that banks must offer product options to their customers, ensuring no mis-selling or forced selling occurs.

He noted that the Bima Sugam platform could help mitigate the issue of mis-selling to some extent.

Speaking at the State Bank of India's (SBI) Annual Business & Economic Conclave, Panda remarked that the bancassurance channel is a highly useful and low-cost distribution method. However, he acknowledged that several issues have recently emerged within the system and urged banks to prioritise their core business of lending.

“I believe there is merit in this (bancassurance) system, but we must approach it with care and caution so that you don't neglect your primary activity and instead focus solely on selling insurance,” he said.

Panda highlighted the need for all stakeholders

On Monday, Sitharaman had also advised lenders to avoid excessive focus on selling insurance and instead concentrate on core banking activities.

India Inc seeks rejig in tax rates ahead of Union Budget

India Inc on Tuesday sought more pre-budget sops from the finance ministry, particularly tax rate rationalisation. Industry bodies have submitted their memoranda to the finance ministry, addressing direct tax issues and other related matters.

Seeking the rationalisation of tax deducted at source (TDS) rates, industry body Assocham, in its pre-budget memorandum to the finance ministry, has advocated for a single or uniform TDS rate of 1-2 per cent for all payments

made to resident assesseees. This, they argue, would reduce litigation over interpretational issues and ensure easier tax compliance.

“Criminal proceedings should apply only when the taxpayer has enriched themselves at the government's expense, and not in cases where certain payments or benefits are provided without applying TDS. We expect tax reforms aimed at reducing litigation and ensuring easier and better compliance to be part of the Union Budget for 2025-26,”

said Assocham president Sanjay Nayyar.

Industry leaders believe that modifications should be introduced to allow taxpayers to make additional claims during assessment proceedings.

FICCI electric vehicle committee chairman Sulajja Firodia called for a cut in GST on batteries and charging services to keep electric vehicles competitive and encourage customer adoption. “We are recommending to the GST Council the rationalisation of GST on EV-related areas.”



India seeks fair free trade deals: Goyal

Commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal on Tuesday stated that India seeks equity, balance, and fair trade while negotiating free trade agreements (FTAs). He also emphasised that India engages in FTAs with countries that are transparent, open, and have economic systems aligned with India's.

“Fulfilling the basic amenities of citizens has been the government's priority over the last decade, empowering

Goyal highlighted the significant opportunities India offers as it progresses towards a Viksit Bharat by 2047, making it the world's best business destination. Hospitality sector opened 30 new hotels with 2,000 rooms in September quarter

Hyderabad sees fastest growth in hospitality

The hospitality sector saw 30 hotels with approximately 2,000 keys opening in the September quarter. The quarter registered double-digit year-on-year growth as well as sequential revenue growth. Hyderabad recorded the fastest growth at 23.6 per cent.

Around 30 branded hotels with a total of 1,988 keys opened during the quarter. Of these, approximately 80 per cent were located in Tier II and III

cities, including Tirupati, Udaipur, Ranchi, and Mussoorie. Karnataka had the highest number of hotel openings, with 280 keys.

In Q3 2024, 96 branded hotels comprising 10,686 rooms were signed. Around 12 of these hotels were conversions of existing properties, accounting for 11 per cent of the total signed inventory. Tamil Nadu led in hotel signings, with 1,247 keys.

Meanwhile, the Revenue per Available Room (RevPAR) for the hospitality sector recorded 10.8 per

cent year-on-year growth in Q3 2024, along with a sequential growth of 2 per cent, according to JLL data.

Hyderabad posted the highest RevPAR growth at 23.6 per cent, followed by Chennai and Mumbai, which recorded year-on-year growth of 17.7 per cent and 16.8 per cent, respectively.

Although occupancy levels remained relatively stable, the Average Daily Rate (ADR) improved, leading to higher RevPAR

across major markets. In Hyderabad, hotel occupancy levels were flat at 0.7 per cent, while ADR grew by 16.2 per cent. Similarly, Mumbai saw stable occupancy at 0.1 per cent and a 15.7 per cent increase in ADR. Chennai, however, experienced a 4.7 per cent growth in occupancy and an 11.5 per cent rise in ADR.

The videos on social media claim that the RBI has launched or supports specific investment schemes. These videos use advanced technological tools to mislead people into investing their money in such schemes, the central bank warned.

“RBI clarifies that its officials are not involved in or supportive of any such activities and that these videos are fake. RBI does not provide any financial investment advice. Members of the public are, therefore, cautioned against engaging with or falling prey to such deep fake videos circulated on social media,” said the central bank.

IHCL TO LINE UP ₹5,000 CR FOR DOUBLING HOTELS

New Delhi, Nov. 19: Tata Group hospitality firm Indian Hotels Company Ltd (IHCL) has earmarked capex of ₹5,000 crore to double its number of properties to over 700 by 2030, its Managing Director and CEO Puneet Chhatwal said.

The company is also looking to double its consolidated revenue to ₹15,000 crore in the next five years, Chhatwal said. “We started our aspiration, saying that it will be the most iconic and most profitable (hospitality) company from South Asia. Having achieved that, we've just tweaked it a bit, and we say we will be the most valued, most responsible and profitable hospitality ecosystem in South Asia,” he said.

India's blind side won't play in Pak

New Delhi: The Indian blind cricket team will not compete in the T20 World Cup as the government has denied the permission to travel to Pakistan due to security concerns, the national federation said on Tuesday. The Indian team was supposed to cross the Wagah border on Wednesday for the event, scheduled to be held from November 23 to December 3. The team had got a No Objection Certificate (NOC), at no-cost to the government, from the Sports Ministry to participate in the tournament but apparently couldn't get clearance from the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). "We have been told unofficially that the blind team will not be permitted to travel to Pakistan. We were scheduled to travel to Wagah border tomorrow. But as of now, no clearance has come from the Ministry officials. So, we are a bit disappointed," Shailendra Yadav, General Secretary of the Cricket Association for the Blind in India (CABI), said. Yadav said that the decision could have been conveyed to the team a tad earlier. — PTI

Shafali dropped from Indian team

New Delhi: Top-order batter Shafali Verma was on Tuesday dropped from India's 16-member women's team for the three-match ODI series in Australia in December after a string of poor performances in the past year. The BCCI selectors seem to have once again lost patience with the 20-year-old right-handed batter, whose recent ODI form has been disappointing. Shafali has scored just 108 runs in six matches this year with 33 being the highest. She was dropped in December last year from the team midway during the home ODI series against Australia on the basis of her poor run, before making a comeback against South Africa in June in Bengaluru. — PTI

Federer hails 'historic' Nadal

Malaga, Spain: Tennis great Roger Federer hailed his former rival Rafael Nadal on Tuesday ahead of the Spaniard's imminent retirement from tennis at the Davis Cup. "Rafa, I have to say: What an incredible run you've had. Including 14 French Opens — historic!" Federer wrote on social media platform X. Healy advises Oz quicks to target Kohli's body, push him back

Sydney, Nov. 19: Legendary Australian wicketkeeper Ian Healy wants his country's pace attack to employ every strategy, from targeting Virat Kohli's front foot to "body bashing" him with short-pitched deliveries, to get the Indian stalwart out in the five-Test Border-Gavaskar Trophy, beginning in Perth on Friday. The star Indian batter has been enduring a lean patch across all formats in recent months, with just two centuries and 11 fifties in his last 60 Test innings. However, despite these struggles, Kohli boasts an impressive average of 54.0 in Australia. Healy has urged the formidable Australian pace trio of Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Mitchell Starc to try and put Kohli on the back-foot. "The first matchup I'm looking at is how our quicks can bowl to Virat Kohli, and I think they should target his front pad quite often," Healy told SEN Radio. "Don't do it every ball because he'll get used to it... it's the impact ball that has to be on the front pad after he is set up with seam." If the tactic doesn't work, Healy wants the bowlers to target Kohli's body. "If that's (front-foot tactic) not working, body bash. Bowl at the back armpit, that's the right arm as a right-handed batsman... and it's got to be hot," Healy said. "Have him jumping at times if he wants to ride those deliveries — ducking, weaving or bending backwards. Get that short leg position right next to him on the leg side and if you need a bumper, it's got to go at the badge. He might try to bust out of a hard spell with a hook shot or pull shot and that will be hard to control if it's badge height," opined Healy. "So that's the second tactic, body bashing," he added.
LEAVE HIM ALONE, SAYS WATSON
Former all-rounder Shane Watson has advised the Australian team to avoid getting into confrontations with Kohli as he feels the intensity the celebrated Indian batter derives from provocations brings the best out of him. "The one thing that I know of Virat is... because the fire burns so brightly and deep inside him, the intensity he brings to every ball that he is engaged in a game has been superhuman," Watson was quoted as saying on the *Willow Talk* podcast. — PTI

Perth, Nov. 19: A shattering defeat to New Zealand on home soil would have caused a "little bit of damage" to India's confidence but Australia will not make the mistake of underestimating the visitors, said charismatic batter Marnus Labuschagne here on Tuesday. The world No. 2 India are heading into the five-Test Border-Gavaskar series, starting in Perth on Friday, following their whitewash at home, which ended their 12-year unbeaten run in their own backyard. Australia's middle-order mainstay Labuschagne believes the loss to the Kiwis would have dented India's confidence. "It's really hard to judge. They played in completely different conditions — spinning conditions — but

"I think that is a good thing in terms of... they are probably a little bit lower on confidence, not coming off a Test victory, losing to New Zealand 3-0. I think that's going to do a little bit of damage to their confidence." However, Labuschagne

insisted that Australia, who have lost each of their last four series to India both home and away, will have to guard against complacency. "They're a quality lineup and they're one of the best teams in the world. So you can never underestimate a team like that," he said. India staged an incredible comeback on their last Australia tour in 2020-21 to win 2-1, despite the absence of regular skipper Virat Kohli and injuries to several other frontline players along the way. "That's what happened in 2021 — the likes of (T) Natarajan played, (Mohammad) Siraj got his first crack in Australia, Washington Sundar played," Labuschagne recalled. — PTI

BUMRAH INDIA'S 'X-FACTOR' FOR AUSSIE HEAD

Perth, Nov. 19: Dubbed as the bowler "impossible to face" by swash-buckling Australian batter Travis Head and a "cat burglar" by former tearaway pacer Brett Lee, Jasprit Bumrah's reputation precedes him. The India pacer, who is set to captain India in the first Test of the five-match series starting here Friday, has left both past and present Australian players in awe of his skill and threat. Not since the golden era of the West Indies in the 1970s has a touring pace bowler struck fear into the hearts of Australians as much as Bumrah, according to the local media here. Head, Usman Khawaja and Steven Smith — all top-order batters — who are set to face Bumrah in the marquee five-match series are unanimous about the pivotal role the Indian pace spearhead can play for India. "Impossible (to face). You try to feel like you're one step ahead, but it always feels like he's that next step," Head told *Fox Cricket*. "Any format of the game, he's incredible. He's their X-factor, he's the guy they go to every time, and more often than not, he's able to produce for them," he added. — PTI

PANT SAYS DID NOT LEAVE DELHI FOR CAPITAL

New Delhi, Nov. 19: Rishabh Pant on Tuesday rejected the legendary Sunil Gavaskar's assessment that the India wicketkeeper-batter left Delhi Capitals due to disagreement over his retention fee ahead of the mega auction of the Indian Premier League. Pant, who captained Delhi Capitals last year after making a comeback from a horrific car accident, is among the marquee players who were not retained by their franchises. He is expected to be one of the most sought-after players when the auction takes place in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia on November 24 and 25. "My retention wasn't about the money for sure that I can say," Pant wrote on X, responding to a broadcaster video showing Gavaskar talking about the auction dynamics. — PTI

Vice-captain Navneet Kaur converted a penalty stroke in the 48th minute while Lalaremsiami struck from field play in the 56th minute for India, who had plenty of scoring chances including 13 penalty corners. India will face China, whom they defeated in the league stages, in the final on Wednesday. Earlier, China beat Malaysia 3-1 in the first semifinal.
